

Home Occupation FAQs

What is a home occupation?	 An accessory commercial use of a residential property by a resident of the property It is the base of operations for the business and the primary function of the business takes place on the residential property. The primary purpose of the property must remain a residence.
Do I need a permit for my home occupation?	 Yes, home occupations require a Zoning Compliance Permit You can find the permit application here The fee for the permit is \$25
Who should I contact before starting a home occupation?	 Town of Hillsborough Planning and Economic Development Division - Zoning 919-296-9470
What are some examples of home occupations	 Barber/beauty salons Internet Sales Accountants Crafts and artist studios
What home occupations are prohibited?	 Boarding of domesticated animals (kennels) Dealerships for firearms or motor vehicles Motor vehicle maintenance, service, or repair Any use that is only permitted with a Conditional Use or Special Use Permit if otherwise located
If I work remotely from home for a business, do I need a home occupation permit?	 No, if you are employed by a company with a separate location that is not a home occupation.
Can I run more than one business out of my home?	No, only one (1) home occupation per location is permitted
Can I operate out of an accessory structure, like a shed?	 Yes, but a home occupation may not occupy more than 500 square feet of an accessory building on the same parcel as the dwelling to which it is accessory. The accessory structure needs to be properly permitted.
What is the maximum total area permitted for use by a home occupation?	The area occupied by the home occupation shall not exceed 25 percent of the heated floor area

	 In no case may the area of a home occupation account for more than 600 square feet of total area on a parcel (dwelling, sheds, and accessory buildings)
How many customers can I have in	No more than 4 customers per hour
my home at a time?	 No more than 10 customers per day
	 No regular and on-going business-related vehicular traffic to and from the home
Can someone who does not live on	No, the principal person or persons providing the business or service
the property operate a business from my residence?	must reside in the dwelling on the premises
Can I advertise the home occupation on my property?	 No, signs or advertising devices that can be seen from outside the dwelling or accessory building are not allowed
Can I have employees in my home occupation?	 The operator of the home occupation may not employ more than <u>one</u> (1) non-resident person on the premises
Can I display my goods outside?	 No, the site of the home occupation shall not contain any outdoor display or storage of goods, equipment, or services associated with the home occupation
Can I modify the structures on the	No, the home occupation shall not cause or result in any change in the
property for my home occupation?	external appearance of the existing dwelling and structures on the property
Is my home occupation allowed to generate much noise?	 No, a home occupation shall not create or exhibit an increase in noise markedly beyond that normally associated with a residential use
How many vehicles can I have on the	No more than two (2) business-related vehicles may be parked at the site
property in connection with my home	of the home occupation
occupation?	 No vehicles with a gross vehicle weight exceeding 5,000 pounds
	 Vehicles associated with the home occupation should not disrupt the area's quiet nature and visual quality
