HIGHLIGHTS

Under a new State law, new irrigation systems connected to the Town of Hillsborough system on or after July 1, 2009 must have a separate water meter.

Our system capacity or “capital facilities” fee for an irrigation-only meter is currently the same as for a regular water service, but sewer fees are not charged.

Our monthly charges for irrigation-only water service are a charge per 1,000 gallons.

Because of the potential for water in or from irrigation systems to flow back into the Town of Hillsborough public water system under some conditions, the Town of Hillsborough has for several years required all new and existing irrigation systems to have a “backflow prevention” device.

Our backflow prevention program is designed to protect the public water supply from water that may become contaminated after it has passed through the Town of Hillsborough system.

Under a new State law, irrigation contractors are generally required to have a State license.


A plumbing permit from the local inspections department is required for installation of an irrigation system.

SEPARATE METERS REQUIRED FOR NEW IRRIGATION SYSTEMS AS OF JULY 1, 2009

Under a State law adopted in 2008, all new irrigation systems connected to the Town of Hillsborough system on or after July 1, 2009 must have a separate water meter. (Separate meters are not required for existing irrigation systems.)

LOCAL PLUMBING PERMIT REQUIREMENTS

The N.C. Plumbing Code requires a permit from the local inspections department for installation of an irrigation system. Orange County Planning & Inspections Department issues permits and does inspections.

CAPITAL FACILITIES FEE & OTHER CHARGES FOR IRRIGATION-ONLY METERS

We charge a system capacity or “capital facilities” fee to cover the cost of the water supplies, treatment facilities, pumps, piping, etc. necessary to provide service to an irrigation-only meter. This fee is currently the same as for a regular water service, but sewer fees are not charged. This fee is likely to be increased every few years, based on historical experience with water demand by irrigation-only customers, which is higher than normal residential demand.

MONTHLY FEES FOR IRRIGATION-ONLY SERVICE

Our monthly charges for irrigation-only water service are a charge per 1,000 gallons of water use. Our rates and fees normally change in July of each year

In water shortages due to droughts, etc., the town may shut-off irrigation-only service. If we turn off service, we will only bill for the actual amount of water used for the affected months (no minimum bill charge).

BACKFLOW PREVENTION REQUIREMENTS FOR IRRIGATION SYSTEMS



A “backflow prevention” device, above, is designed to protect the public water supply from potential contamination.

For various facilities and water uses including irrigation systems, we require customers to install “backflow prevention” devices.

These devices are designed to protect the public water system from potential contamination by water that has passed from our public water pipes into or through a private plumbing system or private equipment.

Backflow prevention devices are required immediately following the water meter on a water service if there is an irrigation system (or other identified “hazard”).

The flow of water from a private system back into the public (Town of Hillsborough) water system could occur under special conditions such as a major water main break or firefighting.

- the type of backflow prevention device that is needed,
- required initial testing of a new irrigation system and annual testing by a certified person, and
- required filing of the annual test report by a certified person.

STATE LICENSE GENERALLY REQUIRED FOR IRRIGATION CONTRACTORS

Irrigation contractors are now generally required to have a state license. However, the exemptions from the license requirement include:

- Federal and State agencies working on public property.
- Property owners performing work on their own property.
- Where the price of all contracts for labor and material is under \$2,500.
- Licensed landscape architects, engineers, general contractors, etc.
- Irrigation for certain construction, agricultural and nursery operations.

CHECKING FOR LEAKS IN IRRIGATION SYSTEMS

We recommend that you, or the company that maintains your irrigation system, regularly check it for leaks. If allowed to continue, a leak can waste a large amount of water-- and dollars. Please note that we do not typically make account adjustments for leaks in irrigation systems.

CONSERVATION REQUIREMENTS

Under normal conditions and our current policies, spray irrigation is limited to one inch per week and 3 application days per week. Irrigation systems are also required to have rain or moisture sensors.

Irrigation systems should be installed, maintained and operated so that water does not run off onto other properties or street right-of-way areas including sidewalks, road shoulders and roadways.
